Anti-social behaviour

A legal definition according to the Crime and Disorder Act 1998- is Section 1(1) of the Act defines acting in an anti-social manner as a manner that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons.

Knife laws

It's illegal to use any knife or weapon in a threatening way.

It's also illegal to:

- carry most knives or any weapons in public without a 'good reason'
- sell most knives or any weapons to anyone under the age of 18

The exception to these 2 rules are folding pocket knives that:

- have a cutting edge no longer than 3 inches
- are not lock knives (they do not have a button, spring or catch that you have to use to fold the knife)

Extremism: holding extreme political or religious views.

Radicalisation: When someone is encouraged to join a group that has extreme views.

Terrorism: the unlawful use of violence and intimidation to bring about political or social change which is often caused by extreme views.
