# Binge drinking

Alcohol poisoning-Alcohol poisoning can happen when you drink alcohol quicker than your body can process it. It can make you seriously ill and you may need to go to hospital

**Binge drinking -** The consumption of an excessive amount of alcohol in a short period of time.

### If you suspect alcohol poisoning

- 1. Reassure them, keep them warm
- 2. Check for injuries
- 3. Place them in the recovery position
- 4. Monitor their level of response

# **Prescription Drugs**

Prescription drugs- some illegal drugs may be prescribed for medical conditions. They will be closely monitored so they don't get misused or a person doesn't get addicted.

## **Anabolic steroids**

Anabolic steroids come as tablets or as a liquid to inject. They are sometimes used by doctors to treat various conditions such as muscle weakness after surgery. They are popular as a recreational drug due to their ability to build muscle mass and improve sports performance. However, if misused they have lots of health risks.
