#### Consent

Consent is a crucial element in relationships, referring to a person's freely given, enthusiastic, informed, and specific agreement to engage in sexual activity or any other activity, and the option to remove consent at any point.

### **Pregnancy** options

Morning after pill- a form of contraception that can be taken after unprotected sex (some within 3 days, some within 5 days)

**Abortion –** terminating the development of a pregnancy.

Adoption & fostering- some may choose to go ahead with pregnancy with a plan to have the baby

### **Sexually Transmitted** Infections (STIs)

Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are common and can be passed on during sex or through sexual contact. They can be treated at a sexual health clinic, pharmacy and doctor. Symptoms of a sexually transmitted infection (STI) can include:

- an unusual discharge from your vagina, penis or anus
- pain when urinating
- lumps or skin growths around your genitals or bottom (anus)
- a rash
- unusual vaginal bleeding
- itchy genitals or anus
- blisters, sores or warts around your genitals, mouth or anus
