<p><b>Prevention 7 Where necessary, wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)</b></p>		<p>for 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms. The symptoms which require pupils to be sent home are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature). Electronic thermometers will be used to take temperature.</li> <li>• new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)</li> <li>• loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you’ve noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal</li> </ul> <p>The 1st Aid room will only be used as a first aid room, please do not use for any other purpose. To support them in doing so, the school will keep a record of pupils and staff in each group through Arbor, and any close contact that takes places between children and staff in different groups</p> <p>A template letter which will be provided by the health protection team, which will be to sent to parents and staff. 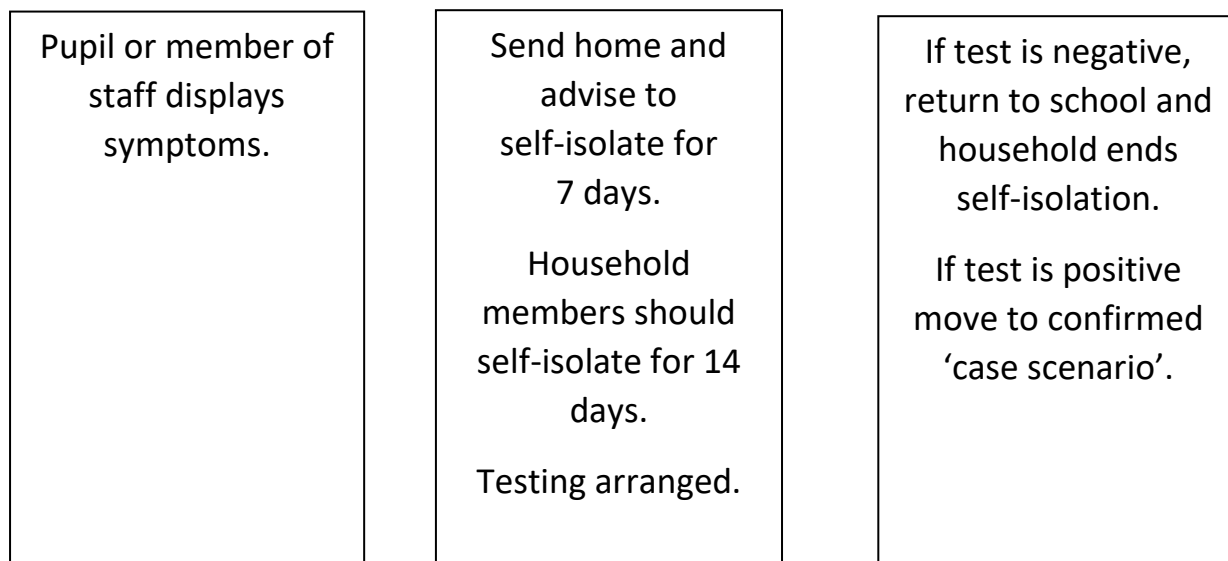
